LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL, MRS. LEE



Dear Middle School Families,

I hope that your family has had the opportunity to enjoy the summer days so far and you and your children are looking forward to beginning a wonderful school year together in September.



As you know, the middle school years are such a critical time in the development of students. I look forward to working with each of you to make this year a success. Relationships and communication are first and foremost to me. This will be supported by my weekly email updates to

families which include links to each grade level's updated website and monthly middle school newsletters. Furthermore, your child's crew leader will be a crucial mode of communication throughout the school year. At Tapestry, we often say the EL motto, "We are Crew," this comes from the value of teamwork, relationships and building a beautiful community teacher. Crew itself is a powerful avenue in which we believe in and come

We will have the opportunity to meet crew leaders and other crew members on Thursday, August 29th from 5:00-6:00 in our Middle School Meet Our Crew Night.



The Meet Our Crew Night will also allow families to bring supplies to the school or pick up previously ordered supplies to leave with crew leaders for the following week as well as locate lockers and receive locks. During this event, families will also receive important documents, including the Student and Family Handbook. The handbook has been updated, including slight changes to the Attendance Policy, Personal Electronic Device Policy and the Code of Conduct. These policies will be discussed in detail during the first Principal Advisory Group (PAG) meeting on Tuesday, September 24th at 8:15 AM.

For the first week of school, 6th grade will start on Tuesday, September 3rd. 7th and 8th grade will start on Wednesday, September 4th. For these first 3-4 days, we will be pausing the typical academic schedule and focus on teaching the PIRR traits through a variety of hands-on learning experiences, gathering baseline readings and mathematic levels as well as team and relationship building that will impact our students throughout the school year. Normal classes will start on Monday, September 9th.

As a leadership team, we have spent time developing this coming year's work plan. Within this plan, we outline the structures and programs to have a positive impact on your child's growth as an academic learner as well as their social and emotional well-being. I look forward to engaging in this very exciting and important work with your children this school year.

Within the middle school building, our facilities team has spent a lot of time renovating the space. The middle school has *grown up* over the summer and no longer looks like an elementary space. It now has a sophisticated, yet fun look.

Programmatically, we have made some adjustments in the course offerings for the 2019-2020 school year. Last year, we piloted the class Expeditionary Literacy as an every other day class. This class provided an opportunity for students to develop and fulfill their academic potential in literacy through the lens of middle school expeditions and case studies.

Given the success and focus on ELA standards in a real world context, we will be expanding this class to an every day schedule in both 6th and 7th grade. Unfortunately, by doing so students will no longer take Spanish in 6th and 7th grade, but will take Spanish and continue to have the opportunity to sit for the Spanish 1 exam in 8th grade allowing students to earn a Regents credit. Additionally, this year we have added a health class for all students in 6th-8th grade. This class places an emphasis on student's physical, social, emotional, mental health by providing a learning environment focused on a safe and healthy lifestyle while teaching students tools to be more aware of and self management themselves. We are confident that these programmatic changes will have a positive impact on your child this school year.

I look forward to seeing all of you on Thursday, August 29th at Meet Our Crew Night!
