### LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL, MRS. LEE



Dear Middle School Families and Caregivers,

We are officially in the second half of the school year! Report cards for the second quarter have just recently been sent home. Please review this closely with your child. We are having supportive Student Led Conferences for some of our students where we feel an additional layer of support and discussion would be valuable in ensuring success for this school year. If your child is eligible for this conference, your child's crew leader

has already been in contact with you. These will take place either in person or remotely on Friday, February 18th. There will be no school on this day which will lead into the February break the following week, February 21-28th. **Students will return to school on TUESDAY, MARCH 1,** after having off on Monday, February 28th for a teacher work day.

Within the past few weeks, all students have taken their NWEA MAPS reading assessment. As an overall notice, we are seeing the effects that the pandemic has taken on reading and learning for students. Please continue to encourage reading routines for your child, 20 minutes of reading each night is recommended. This is an opportunity to tuck the technology away for the day and wind down prior to bedtime. Please connect with your child's ELA Teacher if you want specific information on how your child is performing and for tips on what you can do at home to support your middle school child with their reading. As we are continuing to navigate schooling and the pandemic, please note that should your child need to quarantine in the coming weeks because of close contact with someone who is positive for Covid-19, they are still expected to stay up to date with classwork and homework. Teachers are now available to provide support to *remote* learners on an "as needed" basis. Check your teacher's Google classroom (classwork page) for a FORM to submit indicating what help is needed and a time you are available. Your teacher will get back to you with a meeting time confirmation and directions for using Google Meet.

Bill Traylor displayed simplistic characters of animals, plants, and people that are prized today for their innovative aesthetic form and documentation of oppression in the Deep South. Students represented their own visual imagery with flat symbolized characters innspired by "Hot Topics" from their own community and everyday life.



#### Grade 8

In grade 8 it is wonderful to work with our new rotation of students this quarter. More than one and a half million African Americans served in the United States military forces during World War II. They fought in the Pacific, Mediterranean, and European war zones, including the Battle of the Bulge and the D-Day invasion. Each student in the visual art rotation this quarter illustrated the contributions made by some of these individuals who fought in the war. Students selected a man or woman of honor to research and create an illustration with text in the style of Charles

Alston. Charles Henry Alston was an American painter, sculptor, illustrator, muralist and teacher who lived and worked in the New York City neighborhood of Harlem.
